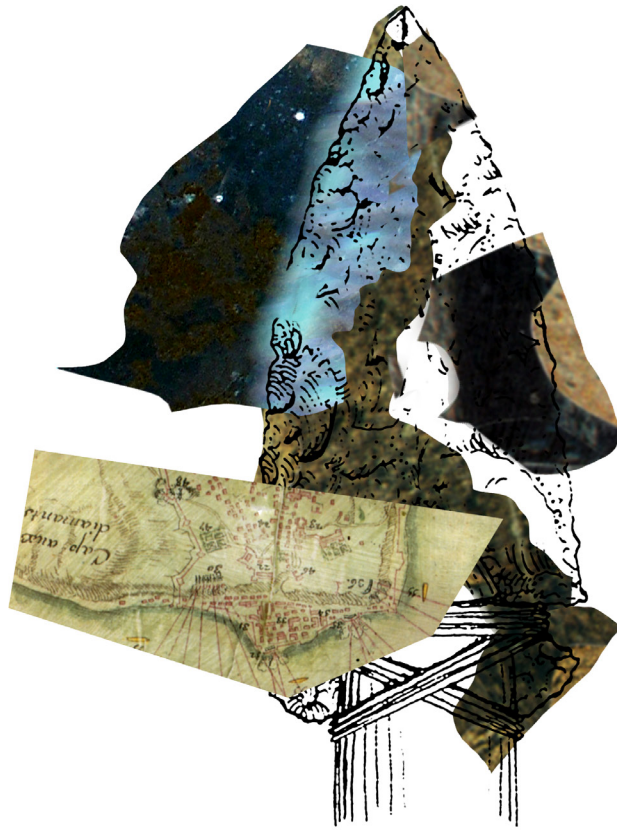


Source: Canadian indigenous objects in National Museums of Scotland
